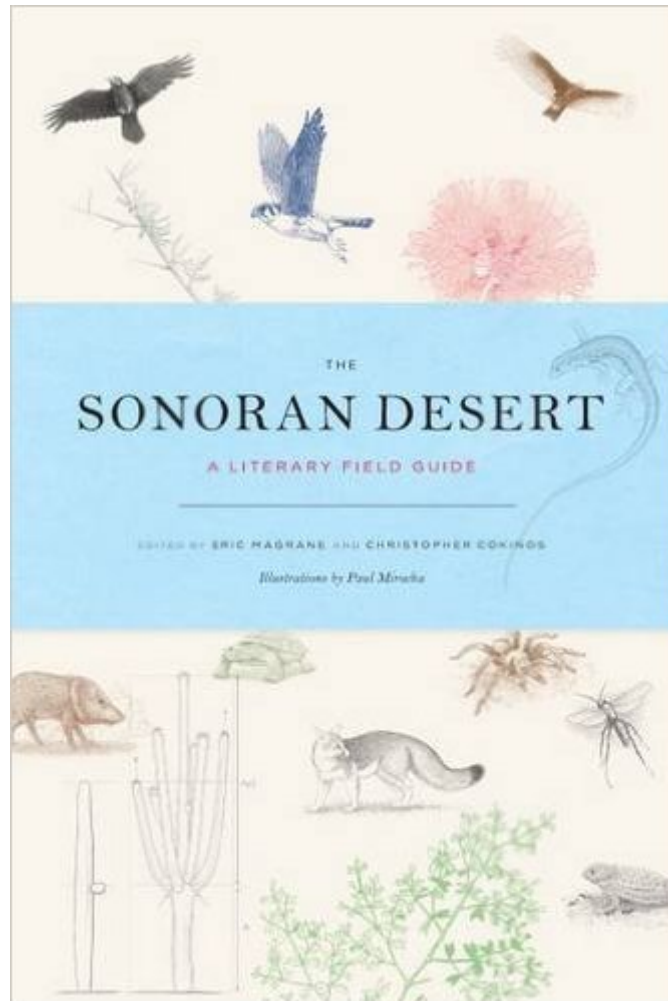

This is a bona fide field guide complete with the requisite info about the flora and fauna of the Sonoran Desert. But the beauty of this guide is that the writers share their take on the life forms that inhabit the desert. Their poems and essays get to the heart and soul of the place and its inhabitants. This book is a true gem!

I bought this to learn a bit more about the desert plants and animals during my upcoming trip. I prefer to travel light so I bought the Kindle version. I'm hugely disappointed. The type size can't be changed and everything is too small to read on the Kindle--about 0.5 point type. Even on the iPad it's too small. You can't enlarge the page and the little magnifier tool doesn't work. The illustrations are lovely and the book looks interesting--based on the few words I read with a magnifying glass. I returned it for a refund. Sorry, but this should not be sold in digital form unless it's properly formatted. What a shame.
