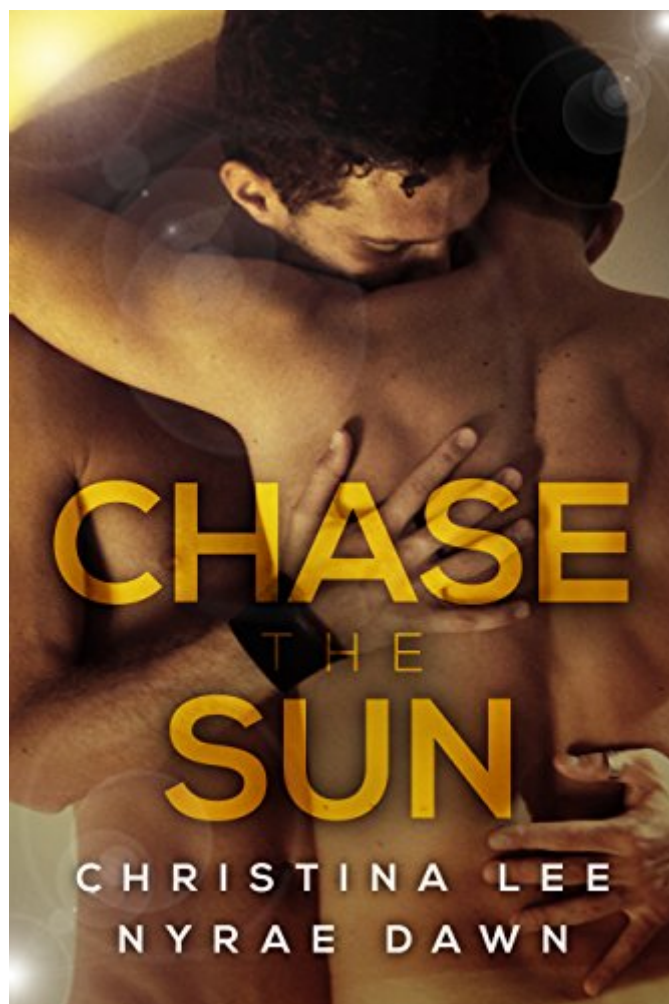

Chase the Sun is the second book in the contemporary new adult MM romance series entitled Free Fall written by authors Christina Lee and Nyrae Dawn. I have read books by both these authors and ended up loving the first book in this collaboration between them. There really was never any doubt that I would end up loving this one. These authors certainly have what it takes to pen a seriously awesome MM romance. A tale about two young men who discover so much more than friendship with each other. Jamie Tolland and Conner Murphy grew up in the same small town in Oregon. While they were not super close friends, they both have fond memories of one another. After high school graduation Jamie stayed in the same town working at his dad's garage, while Conner left for West Hollywood. Jamie loves his family and friends but that does not mean he couldn't stand to have a little more excitement in his life. He does not hide the fact that he is gay; however, he'd love to have a little more freedom when it comes to that aspect of his life. After all, there is only so much you can do in a small town whose tolerance only goes so far. When Conner's uncle, a local in town, passes away and leaves him a classic car, Jamie offers to fix up the car and drive it to Conner in California. Conner is excited to show Jamie around, to show him a little of what he is missing out on by staying in a small town. Neither Jamie nor Conner are expecting the attraction that simmers between them as they spend time with each other. Jamie is openly gay. Conner, on the other hand, is walking into uncharted territory. While he's certainly a free spirit and very fluid with his sexuality, he does not have much experience when it comes to anything but friendship with the same sex.

Jamie Tolland is breaking out of his uneventful, smothering life in Riverfall, Oregon to deliver a car he restored to his old friend, Conner Murphy. Conner escaped Riverfall for L.A. and he is happy to have his old friend bring the car he inherited and stay for a visit. Jamie is a young gay man craving new experiences, adventure, and a vision of life outside of his small town. He's shy, stuck in a rut, and unsure of his own appeal. His life in Riverfall in no way prepares him for the more open and chaotic life in California. In some ways he does not feel like he fits in, but in others he feels more comfortable. Conner is free-spirited, vibrant, funny, and charismatic. He is not sure what he really wants to do with his life. He's antsy, flighty, and frequently moves on to new jobs or experiences. He has always casually dated or at least slept with women, but is also fluid and beginning to look at men a bit differently since he has been hanging out with his friends, Lucas and Gabriel. This is a

slow build as they reconnect their friendship, experience the sights of the city together, and the lines of friendship begin to blur as their interest in each other increases. It is a slow unraveling of their preconceived ideas of each other, and a simmering attraction that finally begins to boil over. I enjoyed the differences in their dynamics in different situations. In some ways Conner took lead and others Jamie did. Being with a man is a whole new world for Conner and makes him even more vulnerable. But they have conflicting ideas on relationships and commitment. Jamie is the settling down relationship kind of guy, while Conner does not think he ever will be.

...more! This is book 2 in the Free Fall series, but can be read as a standalone. However, the leads from book 1 are briefly shown living their very realistic HEA, which is something I'd thought was missing in the ending of that tale, so this was a nice addition. I liked that their HEA was portrayed realistically and in the right depth, and that both were committed to their relationship, but with seemingly no demands or expectations of their selves, or of each other. This book pretty much follows the blurb, but it's done with oodles of additional warmth and with two very, very likable guys who I wanted to see together. Though perhaps the reason they got together was the teensiest bit far-fetched, I liked their instant connection and that neither felt the need to hide feelings/thoughts/words/plans and what they felt were their flaws. They did at times come across as a little young and idealistic, but they felt real. They felt like a couple of Cali guys, from what pop culture seems to portray. There's not a huge amount of sex in this, which doesn't spoil the tale, but I'd have liked the sex to have become entirely reciprocal by the end of the tale, though that wasn't the case, but not that I doubted it would, once the leads had started their HEA. I liked that both admitted that they were it for the other, that both had wanted a HEA and that both took a chance on the other. I liked that neither had any faux hang-ups and that neither played mind-games, and I totally bought why Conner was the way he was, but that he got things done to help himself. I'd also have liked to know what was in the secret pitta sandwich that Conner came up with, as it sounded yum! I also liked that despite their relatively young ages, both seemed 100% in love and committed.
