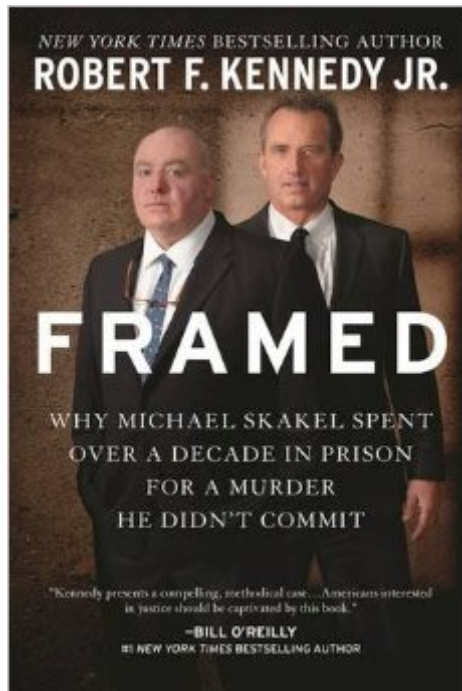

There are many good true crime books, and fewer great ones, but precious few can lay claim to being 'important'. This book can. I confess to going into my reading of the book with arms crossed and brow furrowed. This is because, like most people, I believed the man convicted of the crime - Michael Skakel - was guilty. Why shouldn't I? After all, I watched in amazement as the previously 'most hated man in America' was able to rehabilitate his reputation off the back of 'solving' the Martha Moxley murder. Then Skakel was convicted. I'm sure Mr. Kennedy would agree that at this juncture the onus of proof was now on him. The state had proved Mr. Skakel guilty, after all. Mr. Kennedy claimed to offer proof - not evidence, mind you, but proof - that Michael Skakel was absolutely innocent. I did not believe him, but I was willing to give him the benefit of the doubt.
